



SOON AND VERY SOON

For over 100 years, the temple we worship in has stood against time, wind, ice, rain and variations in temperature. It is far past time for a complete and thorough restoration project to begin. Restoration not only prevents water damage and crumbling but reflects our love for God's House in the Cleveland community and in University Circle.

This multiyear project is divided into six areas around the church. We plan to begin this spring with the Southwest Elevation (also known as the main handicap entrance). A brief overview is included in this month's bulletin. Scaffolding will be erected, and this section will receive a complete and total restoration on every area of deterioration and wear. This is the focus of all fundraising in the CHEST. For anyone whose love for this ministry is its structural health, please consider a generous gift during each service. For those committed to finishing the payments for our new boiler, please write BOILER on your offering envelope.





Above and Below: The southwest elevation is in good condition with the exception of the areas of deterioration on the terra cotta rounded arch entrance. Repairs will include using stainless steel rods and epoxy to mechanically tie the broken units back together. Other areas will be patched and sealed to stop future water penetration. Coatings to replicate the original glaze will be applied to protect the skyward facing terra cotta surfaces. Minor repointing and painting repairs are also needed.





The Chest: Where Does the Money Go?

During offering times, The Chest is opened. All monies dropped into the CHEST are used in restoration projects for the temple.

Our wheelchair lift at the southwest entrance door was purchased by the Mother's Board over 15 years ago. PCC has a service contract. Yet, there are other parts that wear out over the decades. The church had been proactive by replacing worn parts last month that are not covered by a service contract. This ensures that a valuable service is not interrupted.

This spring's restoration plan focuses on repairs to the temple's exterior, as outlined in 'Soon and Very Soon'.


