Stepping Into Our Church History: OUR BLOCK, OUR NEIGHBORS pt II

Last month, we looked at the three large structures on the block encircled by Chester Avenue, East 105th Street, Park Lane, and East 107th Street. All three were opened within three years of each other around 1920. When the financial stresses of the Great Depression began in 1929, the decade of a severely crippled economy impacted the original purposes of these edifices.

When they were constructed, each building included special places where Clevelanders and visitors could meet, converse, and enjoy the company of others. God created social people and knew man was not made to live alone. Successful public buildings have always set aside areas where individuals can interact and both learn from and enjoy friends and strangers.

Park Lane Villa (Park Lane Villa Apartments) and Wade Park Manor (Judson Retirement Community) were originally luxury hotels. Fourth Church of Christ Scientist (Pentecostal Church of Christ) opened as a Christian place of worship. All three artitects understood the importance of fellowship and had prominent areas designed to allow positive interaction among those who passed

through their doors.

OUR BLOCK, OUR NEIGHBORS, CONT ...

In Park Lane Villa, there is a hidden jewel within the building. By passing into the lovely entrance on Park Lane, one enters the Ballroom at Park Lane. This space holds 200 people and has a rich history and vintage architecture. As a multipurpose venue, it can host weddings, parties, dances, and concerts. In the 1960s, The Ballroom featured both Bob Dylan and Arlo Guthrie. When designed, this classic space allowed people to meet, celebrate, and enjoy each other's company.

In 1923, when Wade Park Manor opened, one entered through the door into an expansive lobby constructed of stone and marble. Furnishings provided by Albert Pick and Company were designed in the English style. This first floor entrance was a social gathering place open to the public. Beyond the lobby, there were many lovely meeting areas for a variety of purposes. While visiting fine hotels in India recently, it was an expected custom to enter a hotel lobby, sit down, and enjoy refreshments and relax before checking in. This relax, unhurried custom would have been seen in the lobby of Wade Park Manor. Old friends could catch up on the news and new acquaintances were made. Again, the design of the building promoted the companionship and enjoyment found in face-to-face interactions.





The public meeting spaces in churches are a bit different. The main area is the sanctuary, where worship services are held. A Cleveland Plain Dealer article from January 13, 1918, detailed the new Christ Scientist Church under construction. The auditorium would be 65 by 120 feet in size with a balcony, giving a seating capacity for 1500 people. The Sunday School in the lower 32 by 80 foot auditorium included 47 classrooms and could accommodate 800 to 1000 people. It would be heated by direct steam and even include electric light! The Pentecostal Church of Christ currently owns the building. These large areas are used for worship, funerals, weddings, musical praise, and dinner celebrations. The building is also where the planning and staging for weekly community outreach takes place.

It is such a joy that these century-old structures all offer to uphold the historic need for people to meet, celebrate, worship and come together. "And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another-and all the more as you see the Day approaching." (Hebrews 10:24-25)

FAITHFUL GIVING

In the near future, PCC will begin to build a legacy for the work of God in the community. In his book, Faithful Giving by James W. Murphy, the author describes different types of financial giving.

The most commonly understood is Regular or Annual Giving. For most churches, this constitutes the largest number of gifts. These monies support the church budget and includes salaries, utilities, mortgage/loan commitments, outreach ministries, etc. This type of giving comes from the member's current income and can rise or fall as employment changes or from changes in the economy.

The second most common type of giving is Capital and Major Gifts. These are special commitments which go above and beyond normal contributions. An example of a capital gift is the giving while the boiler was being installed. Some people give major gfits to celebrate a special occasion, such as a reitrement, birth of a child, or in memory of a loved one. This gift is an outward expression of one's commitment to the church.

An Estate/Legacy/Planned Gift is usually one made from a person's estate assets at death or from assets held for retirement. These come from people who have great confidence and trust in the legacy of the church because they are preplanned before a person passes away. For those who choose this type of giving, it will probably be the largest gift they will ever make. This gift will make the significant impact the donor has always dreamed of having. When an individual chooses to make a planned gift to a religious institution, they are raising that church to the level of family in their estate plans.

As PCC plans for generations beyond our lifetimes, these three types of giving factor into the impact the church has over time.

SHOE DRIVE: THE GOAL IS NEAR!



In the last eleven months, PCC has processed 3,575 pairs of shoes to be shipped to Micro Businesses in Third World countries. We have also provided a few hundred shoes to men, women and children in Cuyahoga County in need of foot protection.

Our goal for this drive is 4,125 pairs of shoes. Currently, there are 550 pairs of shoes still needed. Please bring in new and used footwear from men, women, boys and girls. Help us to help others.

The Chest: Where Does the Money Go?

During offering times, The Chest is opened. All monies dropped into The Chest are used for restoration projects in the temple. The question is, "What qualifies as a restoration project?" In general, Bishop Hanna has informed the Board of Directors that the monies placed in the Chest can be used for any restoration or repairs, but the heating and air conditioning costs are excluded. There are numerous projects that are so small or out of the way that most people are unaware of where restoration funds are spent. Currently, two projects are being funded under restoration.

In the boiler room, there are quite a few leaks that allow rain and snow water to come through the ceiling. As a start, huge gaps by the air vent intakes were repaired. Two sandstone sills were aligned correctly and the mortar was repaired. Next steps in this water issue will begin in the Spring.

Another small, but costly, repair is the door handle to our commercial entry door. The part is on order and will be replaced soon.

The weekend before Christmas was a busy season sharing God's love. On Friday, the Evangelistic Ministry Team serviced over 150 men living at 2100 Lakeside and about 50 women living at Norma Herr. The residents so appreciated the food, clothing, toiletries, Christmas cards and candy. It was a beautiful night of fellowship! Donated items from the Usher Board made the evening of Christmas love special.

Then, on Saturday, Angel Tree held its annual gathering to provide Christmas gifts to children of incarcerated parents or guardians. Pentecostal Church of Christ partnered again with Prison Fellowship to coordinate the distribution. This event could not have had the impact that it did without a large number of PCC members and our dear friends of the church. Seventy-nine people purchased gift cards to give each child! This is the largest participation for Angel Tree giving in our church history. Kingdom Life Assembly and Ministerial Fellowship also partnered with the Angel Tree program, as they also do with the distributions on Fridays to those in a challenging housing period. Their continued support has been a pillar to both programs.

Stuffed animals were donated by neighbors, Stan and Helen, were snatched up, cuddled, and given a new home of love. Our constant partner in countless ministries, Strongsville United Church of Christ, donated the children's Bombas socks, along with children's new hats, gloves, and scarves, which their members donated. A Judge from the 8th District Court of Appeals purchases gifts every year for the children. This year, the Judge brought art kits, stuffed animals, coloring books, crayons and candy filled candy canes. These gifts promote creativity and bring smiles to the faces of children.

The next day was Christmas Eve. For worshippers entering the sanctuary, their eyes fell upon an altar covered in red gift bags. These bags were for members, the mothers of the church, and children. Here again, our partners filled the bags and made the gifts possible. A huge thank you to Sister Barbette Smith (Freda), Attorney Nicole Weimar, and the Prince Hall Masons for their donation of toys. Hugs and kisses to Pastor Hanna and the PCC volunteers who packed the bags for this lovely display of God's Love.

The Boiler Repairs Update

As we are warmed by the two new boilers sending steam heat through pipes to our many, many radiators, here is some information on the costs for such comfort. The removal of the old system and installing two new boilers with many repairs to radiators and pipes currently has cost \$156,299.62. PCC Members have currently given \$60,531.68.

It is the desire of Bishop Hanna that this project would not incur debt for the church. As the numbers show, there is still need for money to release the church from this large expense. 
