Albeit, my acceptance of God's existence helps me to understand my purpose and gifting to the world. Where do you have an endless craving for more - more validation, more comfort, more possessions? Are there areas of your life where the constant pursuit of more might be overshadowing the pursuit of God's kingdom and righteousness?

Let's be satisfied in Jesus, first.

THE SEASON OF LENT IS UPON US

LENT

Lent is a season in the Christian Church's liturgical year. It begins on Ash Wednesday. This year, Ash Wednesday Service is held on February 14, 2024. The Lenten season ends on Holy Saturday. This year, Holy Saturday falls on March 30, 2024.

Lent is a 40-day period - this does not include the six Sundays that fall between Ash Wednesday and Holy Saturday. The number 'Forty' has biblical roots in the lives of Moses, Elijah, Noah, Jonah, the Hebrew people, and Jesus. Christians observe this period with fasting, prayer, and the giving of alms. Lent culminates with the hallelujah praises on Resurrection Sunday. The altar will be dressed in purple during the Lenten season.

ASH WEDNESDAY

As Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent, special services are held throughout the Christian world. Ashes are prepared by burning the palm leaves from the previous year's Palm Sunday celebration. Ashes are typically placed on a believer's head in the sign of a cross. This represents an outward expression of a sacred season. As the first day of Lent, Ash Wednesday marks a time of sobriety, humility, and repentance. Ashes, in historical biblical settings, have expressed grief. When ashes are applied to a believer's forehead, one of two expressions are often used: "Repent and believe in The Gospel," or, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

BLESSED OIL

Blessed Oil is based on the Holy Anointing Oil mentioned throughout the Bible. PCC has prepared its own Blessed Oil for decades on the Monday before Ash Wednesday. It is only prepared by the priests of the house. This oil is for ordinations, consecrations, sanctifications, and healings. It becomes a symbol of the Holy Spirit and the power of God. As each year's oil is prepared, the atmosphere is filled with prayer, song, and praise seeking God's blessings as the oil is used throughout the year. We believe by faith that God will heal, deliver, lead and guide. May you be blessed and made whole as you pray and anoint with this Holy Oil.



The Chest: Where Does the Money Go?

During offering times, The Chest is opened. All monies dropped into The Chest are used for restoration projects in the temple.

The commercial door handle on our entry door was replaced in January, along with repairs to the door hardware. The wheelchair lift is aging. The church has a maintainence plan and the structure is serviced regularly. It is time for some major parts to be replaced. This process has begun.

This spring, plans include repairs to the exterior areas of the sanctuary. Many areas are in serious need of tuckpointing. This means that mortar between the bricks has broken away and needs to be fixed. This prevents water from entering the walls of the building and from additional damage when water freezes in the winter. There is also stonework in need of replacement. To begin, we hope to start on the south side of the building.

PCC Shares the Gift of God's Love

It was one minute before midnight on Thursday, August 24, 2023. For three short minutes, a tornado ripped through Cleveland's East Side. It began on East 71st and Chester. It ended on East 89th and Euclid. The length of this tornado's path was just .79 miles. It was only 150 yards wide. No person was injured. No fatalities occurred.

There were trees and branches ripped apart and some property sustained damage. The biggest shock came Friday morning to the congregation at New Life At Calvary church on East 79th and Euclid Avenue. Their roof was gone and much of the supporting stone collapsed. The pictures were all over the news outlets. Pastor Kellie and Assistant Pastor Antonia reached out to the congregation - services would not be held on Sunday.

Monday morning, Bishop Derrick Hanna went over to the damaged building. The day before, he had asked the congregation at PCC to support this congregation in our community. The members immediately gave \$2,100. When Bishop Hanna took the check to the roofless church, he put the check in the Pastor's hand. Pastor Kellie said that he prayed for them and encouraged them during this tragic time. This was the first gift of many to New Life At Calvary. Although no businesses sent funds to allow the church to rebuild, many individuals of faith and congregations in the Jewish and Christian community did.

Today, the congregation has not yet been able to resume services. Mold, asbestos, and lead removal have been a long process. The church office is located in the parking lot. Services are permitted in the gym only once a week for two hours. The church family at New Life At Calvary sent a letter of thanks to PCC at the end of November 2023. The letter states:

"Your donation will have an important impact on our future as we continue our 143 year Ministry here at East 79th and Euclid Avenue. Brothers and sisters, our many thanks go out to you for helping us to move forward with the needed renovation and repairs that will be required after the severe tornado damage. Your support gives our Congregation and the Community encouragement and a stronger commitment despite such a tremendous setback. Many thanks again for your support. May God's kindness and love always be with you in your ministry. Your generosity is a shining example of God's love."

May God continue to allow all believers to support and love each other as we work in the Kingdom of God.








